

8 — Kampong Kapor Methodist Church was built in 1930 and in those days catered to a mostly Peranakan or Straits Chinese (locally born Chinese) congregation, though today services attract all ethnic groups. The whitewashed Art Deco style church, near both mosques and Hindu temples, is a testament to Singapore's religious diversity.

It was built in the 1920s, on the site of an earlier mosque, by Denis Santry, an Irish architect from Swan & MacLaren (a firm responsible for designing many of Singapore's well known Colonial-era landmarks).
